AUDIT REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF

I have audited the attached financial report. The financial report provides information about the past financial performance of the Club and its financial position as at 31 March 2001. This information is stated in accordance with the accounting policies.

Committee's Responsibilities

The Committee is responsible for the preparation of a financial report which fairly reflects the financial position of the Club as at 31 March 2001 and of the results of operations for the year ended on that date.

Auditor's Responsibilities

It is my responsibility to express an independent opinion on the financial report presented by the Committee and report my opinion to you.

Basis of Opinion

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. It also includes assessing:

- the significant estimates and judgements made by the Committee in the preparation of the financial report; and
- whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Club's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

I conducted the audit in accordance with New Zealand Auditing Standards. I planned and performed my audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which I considered necessary in order to provide me with sufficient evidence to obtain reasonable assurance that the financial report is free from material misstatements, whether caused by fraud or error. In forming my opinion I also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial report.

Other than in my capacity as auditor I have no relationship with or interests in the Club.

Qualified Opinion

In common with other organisations of a similar nature, control over the revenues from donations and other fund-raising activities prior to its being recorded is limited and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control.

In these respects alone:

- I have not obtained all the information and explanations that I have required;
- I was unable to determine whether proper accounting records have been kept.

In my opinion, except for adjustments that might have been found to be necessary had I been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning donations and other fund-raising activities, the attached financial report fairly reflects the results of operations for the year ended 31 March 2001.

In my opinion the attached financial report fairly reflects the financial position of the Club as at 31 March 2001.

My audit was completed on 18 July 2001 and my qualified opinion is expressed as at that date.

NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

REPORTING ENTITY

Burnside West Christchurch University Cricket Club (Inc) is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

MEASUREMENT BASE

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical cost basis have been followed by the Club.

SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and the financial position have been applied:

Goods and Services Tax

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

Debtors

Debtors are recognised at estimated realisable value.

Investments

Investments have been recorded at the lower of cost and recoverable amount.

Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Buildings are stated at cost. All other fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation written off to date. Depreciation has been written off on a straight-line basis for Water Reticulation and Fire Escape of 6 years, and Coolrite for 10 years. All other assets have been depreciated for 5 years.

CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

There have been no changes in accounting policies.

All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

Burnside Senior Mens Team

This season was constructive for the squad from the perspective of dispelling some less than complimentary perceptions about the team. The season of 1999/2000 was undoubtedly a major hurdle that had to be overcome early. This process began with critical off season player recruitment and enthusiastic pre-season training. By the time competition games began early in October, we had assembled a more than competitive XI, which defeated Sydenham in the opening trophy round. This win bolstered the atmosphere of the club and gave us a solid platform to develop from. After initially leading the two-day competition, we surrendered our intimidating position through a lack of ruthlessness in certain games. By end of year in both competitions, the season was at a crossroads. Unfortunately, the loss of key players to representative honours exposed our youthful team to the harsh realities of senior cricket. However, with the return of all but one of our representative players, and the much needed guidance of our few senior team members, we rallied and began to fulfil our early season promise. Post Christmas was a new phase for the XI and with our team base now stable, we began to grow into a highly competitive unit. Notable one-day wins were against St Albans and Sydenham in the same weekend, whilst the outright win against LPW was evident of our team's progression. After a disappointing finish in the one-day competition, the team finished fourth in the trophy competition, which established the team as a threatening force for next season.

Individual mentions this year belong to representative players Mark Hastings, Campbell Ogilvie and Nick Horsley. Without doubt, the first half of the season belonged to the evergreen Mark Hastings, who at one stage was averaging over 80 with the bat. Other notable batting performances included 50 by Alex Hedges against St Albans, in a match where he also took seven wickets. Ryan Cutts' debut senior 50 and Mark Coster's debut senior 50 after four seasons toil were team highlights. With the ball, Graeme White led the team with his penetrating swing and seam bowling, with the back up of the experienced Scott Inglis. The team also relied heavily on the economy of Mark Hastings with the ball. Most promising, however, was the emergence of Aaron Phelps as a threatening senior bowler, someone who will no doubt fill a prominent bowling space in years to come. Wicket keeper Jonathan Rea, who showed an inspirational attitude coupled with what many consider the best wicket keeping skills in Christchurch club cricket made an outstanding contribution to the team. Player of the season this year was Ashley Taggart for his consistent middle order trophy batting and aggressive cup competition opening batting.

The season of 2000/2001 puts the team in good stead for the future. With the continued development of the young and exciting talent and the guidance of the minority of senior players, the team will no doubt make its mark in the coming two seasons.

Annual General Meeting Report
2nd Grade

The results that the 2nd Grade team achieved in the 00/01 season has been disappointing, although there were some facets and individual performances that have shone through. Wins were few and far between but the games we did win showed our true guts and courage, exemplifying the Burnside spirit. Perhaps our team's best win was that against Sydenham in a one-day game. Everyone played positively and we won, thanks to some great batting from our numbers 10 and 11 respectively. It was a well-deserved win. The team spirit has always shone through but performances have been lacklustre in spite of this commitment. My personal recommendation would that the selection policies were inconsistent. We seem to have used a lot of players during the year. I realise that the players dropped from senior grade will fill positions in our team but players from outside the circles seem to have been picked on too regular an occasion. I also believe that if a player can not make himself available for one week of a two-day match he should not play at all in that game. Irrespective of whether he is playing well or not. A cohesive unit of 11 players must be available for both weeks. This will help to unify the team, therefore helping to create a winning environment and better team performances. But in spite of this I believe the 2nd Grade team is moving on to bigger and better things. I believe that Burnside has a great player base, especially of younger players with a lot of talent. In years to come I think that Burnside 2nd grade will be a team to be reckoned with, especially with many individual performances that have come from both Junior and senior players alike. The brothers Shackleton, Mark (21) & Paul (19) have both played extremely well. Paul has developed throughout the season into a formidable leg-spinner. An example of this is when he took 8 wickets in an innings Vs St Albans. Mark I believe had an extraordinary season. As one of the senior men in the team I felt he used his head in every game, never giving up. He notched up many good scores also, especially when we were in trouble. Dean Roulston our former captain led the way with both bat and ball. Liam O'Toole also had many good performances with the bat and showed his promise in many of the games, especially when getting on the front foot and playing positively through the covers. When looking back in retrospect to the previous season it is noticeable that we lost many games. I do not believe this is a bad thing as it is shown that in spite of these performances many individuals have played extremely well, showing their true worth. BWU THIRD GRADE MAROON SEASON REPORT 2000/01

This was our second season in the third grade, and it was a season in which we hoped to improve on our rather disappointing (results-wise) first season. Unfortunately, for the most part, this was not the case and it turned out to be another season where we occasionally got ourselves into good positions only to lose, usually as a result of a batting collapse. Ironically, the two wins that we managed during the season came from situations where we had to play really well to win. Firstly, we won a two-dayer against Riccarton when we managed to bowl them out for under 100 on the first morning, only to collapse for even less ourselves. Then, requiring 190-odd for the win, we did it comfortably, winning by seven wickets after very good half centuries from opening batsman Steve Gillespie (50), and Dave Evans (55*). Highlight of the match, though, was the bowling of Jamie Paynter who took 7-69 over the two innings. Our second victory came in a one-dayer against East Shirley Blue where we were set 246 to win. It could have been even more but for the medium and slow bowlers producing some economical spells in the middle of the innings. The run chase was set up by a brilliant innings, played in the rain, by David Evans who accepted the responsibility of opening the innings, a role he was unaccustomed to at the time, and scored 70. Then, after some solid contributions from the rest of the top order, Jamie Paynter played a very well-paced knock of 50* to see us home with 2 balls and 5 wickets to spare. These two wins were the definite highlights of the season.

Unfortunately, we were a team that got close on a number of occasions but just always seemed to lose the close games. The last result of our season was particularly hard to take after we took first innings points off Sydenham, one of the better teams in the grade, and set them 163 to win, only to lose after we just could not remove a particularly hard-hitting Sydenham batsman from the crease.

One of the positives to come out of the season was the captaincy of Jamie Paynter. Our team decided on a new approach this year, appointing two captains. Jamie's role was controlling all matters on the field, while my role was more of a team management one. Jamie, in his first season as a captain of any form, led from the front all season and handled several difficult situations with diplomacy and sensibility. His field placements were particularly well thought out, and he was never scared of trying things in an often successful attempt to make something happen.

We felt that players who had made outstanding contributions to the team needed to be recognised, and so at the end of the season we had a vote not only for the club award for player of the year, but also for the best batsman, best bowler, and the award for effort in the field. These players each received a trophy funded by a (rather substantial) list of fines for offences such as being late to games and dropping catches.

Player of the year was Steve Carey, who won this award mainly for his outstanding bowling which resulted in him averaging 15.7, with an economy rate of 2.91. His 38 wickets made him the top wicket taker in the club. Steve also made a solid contribution with the bat, producing the innings of the season when he clubbed 90 unbeaten runs in no time at all when the team was really struggling. Steve had just returned from the hospital having had a dislocated finger snapped back in when he played this knock.

Batsman of the year went to Jamie Paynter, who played the good knocks when we really needed them, and easily topped the averages with 30.25. He scored almost 500 runs in the season, including four fifties. Jamie is a batsman with plenty of potential, and seems to be a player capable of making some really big scores in the future.

Bowler of the year, and easily our most consistent bowler, was Mike Clark. Mike took 37 wickets at 16.2, with an economy rate of 2.96. At one point of the season, Mike took two wickets each innings for seven innings in a row, and could always be relied on to remove at least one of the opposition's opening batsmen.

The award for effort in the field went to Dave Evans, who, whether he was in close taking brilliant catches or running and sliding through the outfield, gave all he had in support of the bowler and the team as a whole. Dave, along with Jamie, did his best to try to improve the overall standard of our fielding (a definite weakness throughout the season) by helping those less able with their techniques at practice.

Overall, it was another season during which valuable experience was gained both as individuals and as a team.

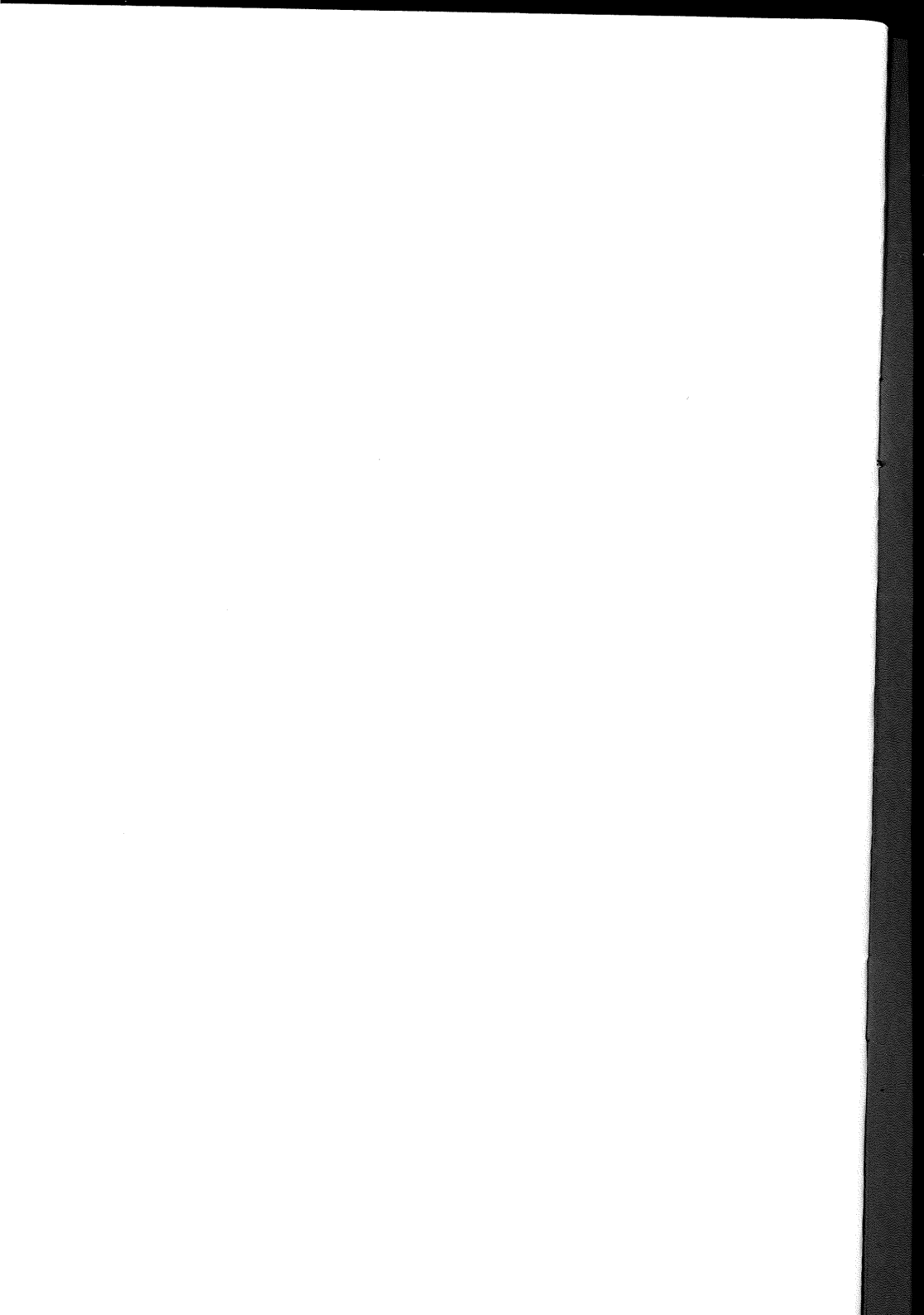
