**MINUTES OF A MEETING
OF THE BURNSIDE WEST CHRISTCHURCH UNIVERSITY CRICKET CLUB
ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING
HELD AT BURNSIDE PARK, BWCUC PAVILION
ON SUNDAY 17TH AUGUST 2003**

C Blackman declared the meeting open at 11.12am by extending a warm welcome to all those present and thanking them for their attendance. He made special mention of CCA Chairman, David Shackleton, CCA President, Brian Adams, CCA staff member Doug McSweeney and Life Members of the Club.

1.0 APOLOGIES:

Apologies were received from Reg Hintz, Bryce McKenzie, Michael Rea, Robbie Chisholm, Kieran Lee, George Howden, Tony Scott and J Summers.

C Blackman moved that the apologies be accepted. Seconded J Thompson.

2.0 MINUTES of the AGM held on 4th August, 2002, were previously circulated and amended as follows:

- (i) Pg. 4 "Ray Burgess advised. . . . that he would not be standing again"
 - (ii) Pg. 2 "Financial Report. . . Paul McGirr tabled a letter of resignation from his office as Club Treasurer"
 - (iii) Ray Burgess questioned why "Election of Officers" took place after "General Business"
- Noted.

C Blackman moved that the amended minutes be confirmed as a true and correct record. Seconded B Hastings

3.0 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

C Blackman, in speaking to the Annual Report, thanked Mark Shackleton and Brian Hastings for their efforts in bringing a good and comprehensive report together.

He commented on:

- (i) The strong financial position of the club, citing considerable effort being put in by John Thompson and Brian Hastings which enabled the club to install its new practice block facility.
- (ii) The commitment the club placed on improving its grounds and pavilion facilities under a sub-committee led by Brian Hastings. As a result, the standards have lifted considerably and good maintenance projects are in place.
- (iii) That with proposed legislation changes to the distribution of gaming machine funds the club may have difficulty in sustaining the level of grants it achieved for the 2002 season.

- iv) The significant growth in the cricket playing area and that the appointment of Garfield Charles had proved to be very good, inclusive of his involvement with the BHS Boys XI. He further commented that Garfield Charles had already commenced a skill session for the senior squad which would be followed by pre-season training in the weeks preceding the commencement of the 2003 playing season. Enthusiasm from the players was reported as being excellent.
- (v) The junior section of the club, in particular their playing strength, and thanked Ross Brown for his dedicated commitment to this very important club section.

He concluded by saying that he felt the club had "*turned the corner*" and that he envisaged the playing strength of the club would be turned around quickly, particularly with the re-structuring of the CCA 1st Grade competition. He went on to say that the club would have to see its 1st Grade side finish in 3rd place or better to avoid relegation. This was alarming in itself and the Committee was not in agreement with the relegation criteria proposed by the CCA. They felt strongly that there were many more facets to a club which determine overall playing strength and that to lose 1st Grade status would have a serious downside for the BWUCC.

C Blackman then moved the adoption of the 2002-03 Annual Report and Statement of Financial Position asking P O'Grady to speak to the financials - Seconded Mark Shackleton

P O'Grady (Treasurer) explained in detail the financial performance of the club in an effort to pre-empt any questions from the floor. He began by thanking C Blackman for his chairmanship of the club over the past twelve months and commented that he believed the committee had worked very well and that this was reflected in the positive financial result.

Questions from the floor were invited but due to the in-depth itemised explanations given by the Treasurer, none were forthcoming. P O'Grady was thanked for a most comprehensive financial report and for an excellent job on presenting the accounts.

6.0 GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1 Convenor for Junior Cricket

B Hastings brought to the attention of the meeting the Committee's inability to appoint a Junior Convenor for the Club's Junior Section was causing concern. He advised that there is a genuine reluctance for someone to commit to this position and that the Committee was trying to overcome the historical workload placed on this one person by appointing Grade Managers. He felt there were a lot of enthusiastic parents involved with the juniors and if anyone knew of anybody suitable that could be approached with a view to filling this role, they were asked to pass their name(s) to him.

6.2 2004-05 BWUCC Centennary

B Hastings reported that a separate sub-committee would be appointed to plan celebrations for the club's up and coming Centennary. He stressed the importance of this event in the Club's history and advised that new carpet would be replacing the old original one in the pavilion at the end of the 2003-04 season. He envisaged that the official celebrations would take place in either February or March 2005.

B Adams suggested that Arthur Grayburn's updated history of the club is utilised and updated for this event.

6.3 Relegation from CCA 1st Grade Mens Competition

G Cross asked what would happen if the club was relegated - would it struggle for players? B Hastings replied by saying that the club was taking a positive approach by striving to finish in the top three placing's for this coming season. He added further comment by saying that he did hold grave concerns with the new structure, with three of the six teams being based at Hagley Oval which worked against the demographics of growing cricket in the suburbs. He acknowledged however that something does need to be done to strengthen the overall playing strength of the CCA Competition.

6.4 Canterbury University Affiliation

G Cross asked what the situation was with the club being affiliated with the University. B Hastings replied by saying that the club is currently jointly affiliated to the University with the Sydenham Cricket Club. A Taggart added that following talks with University representatives, this matter has now been resolved and that by January 2004 the BWUCC would be the only club to be affiliated with the University.

6.5 Nomination for Life Membership

J Thompson wished to nominate two club members for Life Membership, namely Ray Burgess and Paul O'Grady. He gave a brief background on both members commenting that both Ray and Paul had been members of the club in excess of 20 years, both had held numerous positions on the committee for long periods of time and that both had made

immense contributions in their own right in what he could only term as "horrific

workloads".

Seconded Dennis Rea

In reply Ray Burgess spoke of how he had enjoyed every moment with the BWUCC and would still be retaining a strong interest in the happenings of the club despite his preference at this time to practice "underarm bowling" techniques. He concluded by wishing the club all the best.

Paul O'Grady spoke to his nomination, recalling fondly how the first ever coloured clothing Men's 1st class fixture was played at Burnside Oval between Auckland and Canterbury. He indicated he was willing to continue to serve the club at committee level in the next couple of years and felt the club had a good background and a good future to look forward to.

6.6 CCA Business

David Shackleton, CCA Chairman, was invited to say a few words by Brian Hastings. He began by congratulating both Ray Burgess and Paul O'Grady on their Life Membership commenting that hard-working volunteers such as these two were integral to the survival of club cricket.

He went on to say that the CCA Board had been wrestling with the standard of club cricket for some time and that if the competition was left as it was cricket would only deteriorate further.

He stressed that the new competition playing structure had not been a decision that the Board had reached lightly but rather that careful consideration had been given to the decision making and consultative process with clubs. He added that programmes were currently being explored to assist clubs with administration duties.

He touched briefly on the on-going problems with Jade Stadium in terms of cricket preserving its right to play its fixtures there before concluding that the finances of Canterbury Cricket remained a major concern also.

Doug McSweeney, CCA Community Club Manager was also asked if he would like to say a few words.

He advised that the playing start times had changed back to 11 am and that the club handbook is on track to be distributed at the beginning of the season.

January 10 and February 21 have been confirmed as the Christchurch ODI dates which will see club cricket deferred to the Sunday.

There is planning in place to utilise Russell Wylie's skills this season in terms of involving him with the club grounds.

A system is currently being explored which would see results e-mailed to The Press in preference to the current drop-box facility.'

Brian Hastings asked if the CCA draw could rotate the BWU U18 and 5th Grade teams between the grass and artificial wicket on a weekabout rota. D McSweeney took note of this.

6.7 Mel Libeau

B Hastings thanked Mel Libeau for her "stop-gap" secretarial services that were called upon during the year.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed at 12.53pm.

Chairman's report

The 2003/04 season has been one of mixed fortunes for the club on and off the field. The proposed competition changes to a 6 team Premier competition consisting of 6 CCA clubs and a First Grade competition consisting of 3 CCA clubs and 7 Suburban clubs was passed at the AGM. Despite strong opposition from your club, Marist, Riccarton and Sydenham. The CCA board appears committed to the change. Your committee is firmly of the opinion that a 6 team competition with 3 teams based at Hagley Oval is detrimental to the long term development of cricket in Canterbury. We believe geographically, senior teams should be based in the suburbs, to foster adult and junior cricket in their areas. The Hagley clubs do not meet these criteria, under the proposed new competition.

On the playing field the Senior team showed improvement at times with several very good results, however they lacked consistency. With a little bit of luck we could have made the top six. There were encouraging signs from the lower grades. The club extends its congratulations to the 5th Grade SNCC and 6th Grade teams who were first equal in their respective grades. Our 2nd grade and 3rd grade Maroon teams also performed with distinction, both finishing 2nd. Much of this success can be attributed to greatly improved attendances at practice, the coaching of club coach Garfield Charles, and good leadership from Dean Harrison and Geoff Boorer.

The junior section of our club continued to prosper and our congratulations go to all those who achieved representative honours. A new initiative for this season was the appointment of grade managers for all sections of the junior club. It worked well and I thank Roger Fuller, David Wise, Richard Little, and Jane Thomson, and our manager Tony Scott for their tremendous contributions during the season. Thanks also to the junior coaches and managers thank you for your contribution, without your support we would not have a junior section, and we look forward to your continuing support. To Gary Prest and his under 14 side congratulations on your success during the season; you showed that enthusiasm and regular practice gets results.

This year the club reaches its most significant milestone, 100 years, from the formation of the West Christchurch cricket club at Hagley Oval. A centenary committee co-ordinated under Barrie Cummings leadership has a number of activities planned for the weekend of 11/12/13 March 2005. Further details from Barrie can be found later in this report. It will be a great weekend and we look forward to your support of these celebrations.

I wish to acknowledge the work put in by your committee over the season. We are a large club and it takes many hours of voluntary work to run the club. We don't always get it right but I can assure you your committee is committed to improving your club. Progress has been made but there is still a lot to be done to return your club to a pre-eminent position in Christchurch cricket. We need more support at a committee level, if you are able to assist in any way please contact myself or Tony Scott. A special vote of thanks to the chairmen of our main sub-committees, their individual reports will clearly outline what has been achieved.

Early in the season the CCA appointed Andrew Reid to be the club's cricket co-ordinator. His main functions are to foster and promote cricket with schools in our area and assist the club in developing and expanding the junior section of our club, with special emphasis on coaching. He also does similar work with two other senior clubs. Andrew has been most helpful and we look forward to maximising his expertise in the coming season.

There are a number of other individuals I wish to mention. Firstly, thank you to Tony Scott, our

new manager for your contribution. To our ever reliable scorer Tony Feely – 25 years is a remarkable achievement; thank you from us all Tony, especially the senior team. Gerard Cross and Peter Isle continue their support every Saturday, the flags and drinks are important - thanks guys. To Bob Allen for the time and expertise he has given John Thompson on a number of Pavilion jobs. Thank you to our groundsman, Danny Timpson, for his work on the cricket blocks, and a special thank you from the junior average section for the extra work put into the Friday night wickets.

The coming season is the most significant in the club's history. We celebrate our century. On the field we look forward to success, especially from our senior teams. I urge all club members to support the club after cricket in the clubrooms. Lets build on a really good club spirit that is developing.

I look forward to seeing you in the coming season.

Obituary

Ana Rouse 1930-2004

Ana, who passed away March 2004, was the first Maori woman to play cricket for New Zealand when she toured with the national team to Australia in 1957.

She played for the Mai Moa club, which later merged with Burnside West-University. She was a stylish left-handed batswoman and also an accomplished wicketkeeper.

The club extends it's deepest sympathy to her surviving daughters and son.

Treasurer's Report

It is my pleasure to present this years Treasurers Report and Financial Statements.

The last year has seen steady financial progress made by the club. The large surplus enjoyed by the club last year was not repeated, however we have made significant strides in important areas such as more adequate planning and budgeting for the future.

Proactive planning will help the club maintain its healthy financial status; which is important when considering the changes that may be forced upon us. Changes to the way in which charitable trusts are allowed to operate will adversely affect the financial status of sporting and non-sporting clubs, and especially small clubs like ours that are heavily reliant on community grants to ensure that we can maintain a high level of service for our members. Let us all hope that proposed changes to these laws do not affect our club in such a way that endangers our survival.

This year income was based heavily on grants, donations and members subscriptions. Although we have covered expenditure the nature of preparing financial statements indicates a healthy profit. If we did not have income from donations and community grants the club could not afford coaches and managers.

Maintenance has been carried out on the decking area and guttering. Planning is under way to update the interior before the Clubs centenary. Thanks to John Thompson and Bob Allen for this work.

Eftpos was installed this year and has been a great help in cash flow. It is important for Club finances that subscriptions are collected at an early date. The coming season will incorporate all technology to achieve this.

Many thanks must be extended to Paul O'Grady, last years treasurer, who has carried out most of the mechanical functions of being treasurer of the club this season. Without Paul's guidance I would not be able to maintain the high standards that he and others before him established.

Note 1:

Reporting Entity

Burnside West Christchurch University Cricket Club Inc is an Incorporated Society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

Measurement Base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical cost basis have been followed by the club.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and position have been applied. There are no changes in accounting policies.

Goods and Services Tax

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

Sundry Debtors

Sundry debtors are recognised at estimated realisable value.

Investments

Investments are stated at cost less depreciation written off to date. Depreciation has been written off on a straight line basis for Water Reticulation and Fire Escape of 6 years. All other assets are depreciated over 5 years.

Audit Report

TO THE MEMBERS **OF BURNSIDE WEST CHRISTCHURCH UNIVERSITY CRICKET CLUB INC.**

I have audited the attached financial report. The financial report provides information about the past financial performance of the club and its financial position as at 30 April 2004. This information is stated in accordance with the accounting policies.

Committee Responsibilities

The committee is responsible for the preparation of financial reports, which fairly reflect the financial position of the club as at 30 April 2004, and of the results of operations for the year ended on that date.

Auditors Responsibilities

It is my responsibilities to express an independent opinion on the financial report presented by the Committee and present my opinion to you.

Basis of Opinion

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. It also includes assessing:

- the significant estimates and judgments made by the Committee in the preparation of the financial report; and
- whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Club's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

I conducted the audit in accordance with New Zealand Auditing Standards. I planned and performed my audit so as to obtain all information and explanations which I considered necessary in order to provide me with sufficient evidence to obtain reasonable assurance that the report is free from material mis-statements, whether caused by fraud or error. In forming my opinion I also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial report.

Other than in my capacity as auditor I have no relationship with or interests in the Club.

Qualified Opinion

In common with other organisations of a similar nature, control over the revenues from fund-raising activities prior to its being recorded is limited and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control.

In this respect I have not obtained all the information and explanations that I have required.

In my opinion, except for the adjustments that might have been found to be necessary had I been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning fund-raising activities, the attached financial report fairly reflects Club operations for the year ended 30 April 2004.

My audit report was completed on 26 July 2004, and my qualified opinion is expressed as at that date.

Senior Cricket Committee

The 2003/2004 season was a highly successful period for Burnside cricket. When competition commenced in November, eleven senior men's teams and two women's teams were entered in the CCA competition, making Burnside the largest senior men's club in Christchurch. When the season concluded Burnside had collected the men's Fifth and Sixth Grade trophies, and placed second in the mens Second, Third and President Grades.

Prior to the season commencing, the CCA board announced the two-day senior competition would be reduced to six teams beginning in 2004/2005. To be assured of a place in the competition without relying on other results, the senior team had to finish in the top three. After an extensive pre-season programme and the signing of Glamorgan professional Darren Thomas, the players were confident of achieving this. Regrettably, they finished seventh in the two-day competition and sixth in the one-day competition. They competed well in all their matches and with better application in the final hour of two-day matches against Sydenham and HSOB, they would have achieved their goal. Although the team are disappointed with the result, all the players are determined to win the Suburban grade in 2004/2005 and return to the premier two-day grade in 2005/2006. Despite the result, the season was not a failure, there were significant improvements in player attitudes, the execution of an attractive style of cricket and the developing combination of coach Garfield Charles, and captain Jonathan Rea. The 2003/2004 season was a very successful one for BWU Maroon. We were dominant and consistent throughout the season and were agonizingly close to achieving our goal of winning the grade. Our squad evolved through the season but remained well balanced and competitive even when a number of players were contributing to our 2nd Grade team's successful campaign. The team played in good spirits and was very easy to captain.

Our batting was particularly strong this year and a lack of genuine tailenders made selecting the batting line up very difficult. No less than 12 different players shared in the 17 half centuries and 1 century scored by the team and only in two matches did the team fail to produce at least one half century – one of those matches being our only loss of the season. Leading our batting from the top were Player of the Season, Ben Allan scoring 328 runs at 29.8 including innings of 72, 60 and 77, Mike Robins with 353 runs at 32.1 including innings of 92 and 71, and Liam O'Toole scoring 240 runs at 26.7 including innings of 56, 70 and 60 not out. Mark Shackleton re-joined the team after Christmas and made an immediate impact with innings of 47 and 54 at the top of the order. Geoff Boorer had scores of 77 and 101 in the middle order while Luke Lindsay contributed a couple of important innings early in the season including 50 against Riccarton.

Of particular note were half centuries for four of our allrounders. Daniel Allan (56) and Gareth Gibson (66*) combined for a match winning 105 run 8th wicket stand against East Shirley Blue after our top order collapsed. Daniel Nielsen had a solid day at the office against BWU Gold hitting 50 not out then taking 5-35, while Richard Clare smashed a brilliant 53 batting at number 9 against East Shirley Gold after another middle order collapse.

Other innings of note were Canterbury Draught's (still named Gareth Lawson at the time) first match 32 against Sydenham, Peter Yardley's patient 22 against Old Cols in a low scoring match, Christian Roger's agricultural 31 not out against Riccarton and Campbell LeHeron's 28 not out against Old Cols. Justin Summers returned from long term injury with three solid innings including 62 against Riccarton while Euan Stewart scored 50 against East Shirley Gold in his first innings for 2-3 years.

Our bowling was led by three of the best bowlers in the competition this year. Daniel Nielsen with 26 wickets at 10.8 was unplayable at times and his 9 wickets in the final 2 day match against East Shirley Gold was very impressive. Campbell LeHeron was absent for 5 days cricket due to his wedding but still managed to take 28 wickets at 13.7. Campbell's bunny team was Old Cols who he took two 4-wicket bags against. Gareth Gibson started his BWU career with a marathon 21 overs against LPW and consistently took wickets to finish with 23 wickets at 13. In the final match he lifted his pace significantly which East Shirley were unable to cope with and his 4-19 was thoroughly deserved.

Geoff Boorer's 29 wickets at 11.7 managed to squeeze Campbell LeHeron out of the top wicket taking spot. His ability to take wickets with his deceiving full tosses proved a valuable asset late in the season. Peter Yardley's bounce provided numerous unplayable deliveries and resulted in a couple of crucial wickets. However, his unfortunate ability to take wickets off no-balls prevented him taking the number of wickets he deserved. Richard Clare's best bowling was his 3-18 when he opened the bowling against BWU Gold. Golden Arm Daniel Allan took wickets with every chance he was given at the bowling crease, usually in pairs, while Canterbury Draught's ability to tie up an end earned him a number of wickets. Daniel Hamilton produced a brutal spell of 4-11 against Riccarton while Christian Rogers and Scott Bermingham made very important contributions against LPW in particular.

Ben Allan and Mike Robins both furthered their claims as genuine allrounders when they produced devastating innings ending spells. Ben Allan's cunning leg spinners netted him 1-6 (0.5 overs) for

the season, while Mike Robin's deceiving doosra left him with 1-0 from his single delivery of the year.

Our fielding was of a generally high standard. We took a high percentage of our catches with Peter Yardley and Liam O'Toole taking a number of catches each in the cover/point and slips/keeper regions respectively. Mike Robins and Ben Allan shared the bulk of the keeping duties. Ben was particularly impressive considering this was his first year as a keeper, claiming several very difficult catches. Liam O'Toole and Henry Cook also performed admirably with the gloves when called upon.

There were a number of significant and memorable matches for us during the season. We struggled back to a draw against arch-rivals LPW after looking set for defeat. We recovered from 93/7 against East Shirley to score 231 and we battled through a wet and dodgy pitch for a satisfying win over an unjustifiably arrogant St Albans team. Two hard fought wins over the talented BWU Gold team were also crucial even though they were unfortunately under-strength for both matches.

We had only a few disappointments during the season. We dropped three easy bonus points in our win over Riccarton. We batted poorly in our draw against eventual competition winners LPW. Overall 2003/04 was a very impressive and enjoyable season for BWU Maroon. We played with aggression and confidence and were unlucky not to win the competition. A couple of our players are likely to make the step up to second grade next year but we should otherwise be full strength for the coming season and have a good chance of taking the competition. With BWU Gold finishing last season so strongly there is a great chance for BWU take the top two spots next year, Maroon at the top of course.
